

## TERRIFIC KIDS

Established 1999

- The Terrific Kids Program is offered to Fifth graders in selected C-2 elementary schools.
- The purpose is to motivate children to develop **positive attitude, good character,** and **responsible leadership.**
- Students may be selected for the honor once, twice or may not achieve the goal that was agreed to jointly with the teacher.
- Because students only compete against themselves, developed goals are attainable.
- Recognition is once a month at the school's Terrific Kids Assembly.
- Recipients receive a Kiwanis Terrific Kids Pin and Certificate, their picture in the local newspaper and gifts from Raytown businesses.
- Participants: Blue Ridge, Laurel Hills, Fleetridge, **Norfleet**, Spring Valley, Robinson, and Westridge.
- Fifth graders are encouraged to participate in the Kiwanis **Builders Club Program** at their middle school.

## BUILDERS CLUB

Established 1995

- The Builders Club Program is offered to middle school students in the C-2 School District.
- The purpose of the Builders Club is to give time and energy **to serve school, community, and others.**
- Membership is open to all who want to be in service.
- The club meets bi-weekly with faculty sponsors and Kiwanis members.
- Raytown South Middle School is the current participant.
- Middle school students are encouraged to continue their service work in the **Key Club** at their high school.

## KEY CLUB

Established 1960

- The Key Club Program is offered to high school students in the C-2 Schools.
- The purpose of the Key Club is **to serve the school, community, and others,** and to enjoy a close working relationship with the Raytown Kiwanis Club.
- Membership is open to all who desire to serve. Dues are to be paid annually by the student to Kiwanis International.
- The club meets weekly with faculty sponsors and a Kiwanis member.
- Raytown High School is the current participant.
- High school students are encouraged to continue service work in college by joining **Circle K**, sponsored by Kiwanis International and a local Kiwanis Club, and then to take part in a community Kiwanis Club as an adult.

## READING PROGRAM

Established 2002

- Members of the Kiwanis Club have read to kindergarten children at Laurel Hills and Westridge Elementary Schools.
- Kiwanis purchases recommended books for each classroom, enabling students to individually read the new books after the Kiwanis reading. This expands each child's knowledge and vocabulary.
- Adult readers are available weekly.
- The Reading Program was begun as an outgrowth of the Terrific Kids Program.
